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ABOUT THE PROGRAMME

- A three-year ultra-premium fibre project is calling for farmers who are keen to 'feel the potential' of the \$2B global cashmere fibre industry.
- 'NZ cashmere – sustainably beautiful' is a programme between New Zealand Cashmere and the Government's Sustainable Food and Fibre fund.
- It builds on the multimillion-dollar investment into cashmere processing facilities made by Woolyarns – the company behind the globally successful Perino yarn brand which underpins the possum fibre industry in New Zealand.
- The programme has a focus on supporting farmers with advice as they enter the industry so they can sustainably farm goats within their existing farm systems to produce ultra-fine cashmere fibre for export.
- Key workstreams include the development of traceability processes so the unique sustainability story and product attributes of the fibre can generate additional value in the market.
- Cashmere fibre currently returns between \$110-\$150NZD/kg, and Woolyarns has relationships with leading European fashion houses which enables them to offer long-term fibre contracts through New Zealand Cashmere so farmers can take advantage of the global market demand.

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- New Zealand Cashmere GP Ltd. was established to drive the renaissance of the cashmere fibre industry in New Zealand.
- New Zealand Cashmere's vision is to 'lead a world-class sustainable, traceable, one million cashmere goat industry in New Zealand'.
- The company is 100% owned by Woolyarns Limited – a global leader in spinning ultra-high-end fibres for the world's leading fashion houses.



- Woolyarns is known as one of the world's leading innovators in yarn engineering.
- Woolyarns is a textile manufacturer, based in Lower Hutt, supplying spun yarns to both domestic & international knitting and weaving companies.
- They were at the forefront of establishing a possum fibre procurement company and commercialising the fibre into a successful end use.
- Today the possum industry contributes circa \$150m annually to New Zealand through retail sales.

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Through the power of research and development in breeding goats, New Zealand Cashmere goats are now suitable for our local farming systems and conditions while producing some of the most luxurious, fine fibre that the world has seen.

ALTERNATIVE TO BLANKET FORESTRY

Keep farming and utilise your harder country. Goats enable you to grow high value produce (fibre and meat) and utilise land that has traditionally been unproductive or low performing.

ENVIRONMENTAL COMPLIANCE

Goat farming offers an option for low-impact agricultural diversification to meet environmental compliance regulation.

PREMIUM FIBRE RETURNS

Cashmere fibre is worth up to \$150 per kilo. Due to the strong heritability of cashmere traits, many farms are able to produce fibres of 16 micron and lower in the first two years.

GENETIC GAIN

Enjoy the significant and rapid genetic gain in goats with your own breeding programme. Start your foundation flock and secure purpose-bred cashmere bucks today.

IMPROVED CAPITAL STOCK

Goats graze differently than sheep, cattle and deer and can help pasture quality. There is potential in farming systems integrated with goats to increase meat and fibre production per hectare, and finish stock faster by improving growth rates.

WEED CONTROL

Goats enjoy a varied diet, targeting most weeds before clover or 'better quality' pasture. Reduce your spray costs and chemical usage, as well as minimising your environmental footprint.

SECURE MARKET

The partnership between New Zealand Cashmere and Woolyarns provides peace of mind. A secure buyer for cashmere fibre is already in place. Fibre supply is required, and lots of it. Goat meat is also in high demand globally and a number of NZ meat processors are taking stock now.
